

Timeline Book Report

1. Read a book about an important African-American figure. **No one should prepare a report on Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.** He was used as our example.
2. Follow the attached directions to make a timeline - you must have all 7 panels filled in with information. (See directions #3 and #4.)
3. All written work must have proper capitalization, punctuation, and grammar.
4. Each panel must be illustrated.
5. Your report must be turned in on time.

Suggestions:

Read the book completely first. Then, on a piece of notebook paper, write down the important dates from your book. Make sure they are in chronological order - proper time order. (For example: 1921, 1935, 1942, 1963, 1975, 1989, 1992, 2005.)

If your subject is deceased, the last date will probably be the day he/she died. However, it might not be. For example, if you did MLK, the last date might be the day his birthday became a national holiday. That happened after MLK's death.

Once you have a draft, then you can make the timeline.
